FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Department of Social Services, Department of Transportation, the Department of Insurance, the Department of Mental Health, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, and the State Treasurer's Office assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** state this proposal extends the exclusion of specialty hospitals from licensure as a hospital from August 28, 2005 to August 28, 2007. DOH states the amendment will allow DOH to license as a hospital specific specialty hospitals located in areas meeting specific population criteria.

DOH states there would be an unknown cost to the DOH since the DOH does not know how many of these specialty hospitals may exist in the defined population areas (Jackson, Platte, Cass & Clay counties). The number of additional inspection staff needed would be dependent upon the number of specialty hospitals located within the defined population areas. DOH assumes that the fiscal impact of this proposal would be costs to General Revenue of greater than \$100,000 annually.

Because it is uncertain as to the number of specialty hospitals in Jackson, Cass, Clay and Platte
