FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with the **Department of Agriculture**, **Department of Public Safety** – **Missouri State Highway Patrol**, and **Department of Revenue** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials with the **Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** assume this legislation would allow additional commercial vehicles to travel within this state at greater weights without abiding by standard safety guidelines adopted at the federal level. MoDOT assumes Missouri would lose all federal funding received from the Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP). The projected FY05 MCSAP funding is \$2,316,843.

Oversight assumes that any potential loss of federal funding is speculative and, thus, assumes no fiscal impact on federal funding.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This act increases the weight limit for farm vehicles from forty-two thousand pounds to eighty thousand pounds or the maximum gross vehicle weight provided by law. This language continues the exemption for properly marked farm vehicles to haul materials without operating under the regulations set aside for commercial vehicles, unless such vehicle is transporting hazardous waste.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
