FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small wine manufacturers in the state could increase the hours of operation of their liquor by the drink retail establishments and also would be allowed to sell a limited amount of non-Missouri made wines as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

Section 311.070, RSMo, allows wine manufacturers to apply for and be issued a license to sell intoxicating liquor be the drink if the premises is in close proximity to the winery. Currently, there are limitations as to when the premises may remain open. This proposal provides that such premises must be closed between 1:30 am and 6:00 am on weekdays, and between 1:30 am Sunday and 6:00 am Monday. However, such premises may remain open between the hours of 9:00 am and midnight on Sunday.

Section 311.070, RSMo, also allows a person to apply for and be issued a license to sell intoxicating liquor by the drink. This proposal requires that 75% or more of the drinks sold shall be Missouri-produced wines.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
