FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation requires that school districts meet the requirements of Section 160.530, RSMo, in order to be eligible for state aid. The section requires, as a condition of receiving state aid, that school districts allocate one percent of their state aid to the professional development committee of the district.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
