## **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** and the **Office of Attorney General** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DOS) - Children's Division** assume this proposal would give the same protections of the agency to DOS private agencies that contract with the DOS. DOS assumes this proposal would allow more private agencies to bid as contractors and allow the DOS to have greater choice in private contract agencies. The DOS assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal provides that a private contractor who provides services to children and families as directed by the children's division within the Department of Social Services and who receives state moneys from the division or the department shall be immune from criminal and civil liability for providing such services. The immunity to the private contractor will be the same immunity from criminal and civil liability granted to the children's division when the division or department directly provides such services.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
