FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** and the **Department of Public Safety** – **Director's Office** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume the proposal provides that notification given to a crime victim must utilize the statewide automated crime victim notification system.

Passage of this bill would provide savings for DOC in the form of eliminating postage and office supplies that were used for hard-copy mail-outs for victim notification. Telephonic notification would now be the primary method for communication of information. Letters would only be sent when the automated system couldn't be used.

In summary, the exact savings to DOC is unknown but has the potential of up to \$10,000 per annum.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation would require that notification given to a crime victim of an offender's release utilize the statewide automated crime victim notification system. If the system cannot be used, written notification by mail to the most current address would be sufficient.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
