### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses would be fiscally impacted as a result of this proposal. Costs would be for the purchase of defibrillators and training.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposed legislation requires every health club to have at least one automated external defibrillator on the premises. The proposal requires the defibrillator to at all times be deployed in a manner consistent with the requirements prescribed under Section 190.092 and to have at least one employee trained on the use of the defibrillator per shift and on duty during hours of operation.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
