DESCRIPTION


This proposed legislation pertains to the detachment of territory for water supply districts.

The proposal modifies the circumstances where territory located in a district can detach; with this proposal, such a detachment can occur for territory to which the district has not made service available. The proposal changes the financial language to make it consistent with the federal statute. New language has been added to require any political subdivision or private entity to first petition the court for the territory in question to be detached before any infrastructure may be built.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
