### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of Administration** (OA) stated, based on 11/30/05 semi-monthly payroll, there were 4,832 union dues deductions to certified bargaining representatives totaling \$45,810.81. The bill calls for \$8/month or 2%, whichever is greater to be paid to the state from the dues withheld. A deduction of \$4.00 per semi-monthly paycheck would total \$19,328 or \$463,872 per year.

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** assume the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission (Commission) would be required to maintain copies of public employee labor organization reports related to contributions and expenditures. The Commission would require additional storage space, staff time and possibly new scanning equipment to maintain these reports. The Commission is unable to estimate the amount of staff time needed because the amount of information submitted by the labor organizations is unknown. However, the Commission estimates the fiscal impact to be under \$100,000.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

## **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal would require a specific employee authorization for public employee labor unions to withhold fees from paychecks. It would impose a fee on withheld funds based on the greater of eight dollars or two percent of the amount authorized by the employee for deduction, to be retained by the Office of Administration. In addition, it would require public employee labor organizations to maintain records of fees authorized and withheld, and transferred to committees, and to send copies of those records to the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
