FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** state their sex offender registry currently has 182 persons listed. Officials assume they would require minimally a full page ad in each of two local newspapers. The Columbia Missourian would charge \$1,789.20 for this ad for one day. The Columbia Daily Tribune would charge \$1,921.50 for this ad for one day. This totals \$3,710.70 for both ads for one day. Since their registry and all required information is posted on their website, it is not likely the Boone County Sheriff's Department would choose to publish this in the newspapers unless mandated by law.

Officials from the **St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department** assume the legislation is permissive and would not have a fiscal impact on their department.

Oversight assumes local law enforcement agencies would experience a cost of publishing the sex offender information in the newspaper, should they choose to do so. However, Oversight has shown no fiscal impact because the language in the proposal is permissive.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation allows the chief law enforcement officer of any county or St. Louis City to publish sex offender registration information about offenders residing in the county or St. Louis City in a newspaper during National Crime Victims' Week, as designated by the U.S. Department of Justice. The published information can only include the name and address of the offender, a photograph, and the crime for which the offender must register.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
