#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion the proposal, in its present form, has no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** state the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs currently has three (3) Investigator II positions and one (1) Investigator III position to conduct inspections and investigations of the approximately 26,000 state controlled substance registrants (26,000/4 = 6,500 registrants per investigator).

There have been 5001 advanced practice recognitions issued by the Missouri State Board of Nursing, effective January 3, 2006. It is assumed that all of these individuals will seek registration with the DOH, Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs. As a result, one (1) additional Investigator II will be needed to respond to the increased workload in performing enforcement activities for the increased number of registrants. The salary of this individual is calculated at the market rate of \$36,612 per year.

The DOH also states additional registration fees will be generated by this proposal for approximately 5,000 new registrants at \$90 (\$450,000) per three-year registration. This amount ASSUMPTION (continued)

will be received primarily in a three-year cycle due to the three-year term of the registrations issued, except for individuals beginning practice in Missouri in intervening years.

**Oversight** has, for fiscal note purposes only, changed the starting salary for the Investigator II to correspond to the first step above minimum for comparable positions in the state's merit system pay grid. This decision reflects a study of actual starting salaries for new state employees for a six month period and the policy of the Oversight Subcommittee of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research.

Oversight assumes the DOH will not require rental space for one additional employee.

This proposal will result in an increase in total state revenue.

Small businesses that currently pay fees for controlled substance registrations for their practitioners will incur an additional cost in paying for the registrations of their advanced practice nurses.

### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal authorizes an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined in Section 335.016 as a nurse who has had education beyond the basic nursing education and is certified by a nationally recognized professional organization as having a nurse specialty, or who meets criteria for advanced practice nurses established by the board of nursing, to prescribe schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substances under a collaborative practice agreement, as defined in Section 334.104.

This proposal also provides that within thirty days of any change and on each renewal, the state board of registration of healing arts shall require physicians to identify whether a physician is engaged in any collaborative practice agreement or physician assistance agreement and also report to the board the name of each licensed professional with whom the physician has entered into such agreement. The board may make the information available to the public. The physician shall also provide the board with a copy of each such agreement for the board to review for compliance with state law.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
