FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol, – Director’s Office, Office of the State Public Defender, Boone County Sheriff’s Department, Springfield Police Department,** and the **St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume the proposal would not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors.

Officials from the Columbia Police Department, Greene County Sheriff’s Department, Jackson County Sheriff’s Department, Kansas City Police Department, and the St. Louis County Police Department did not respond to Oversight’s request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation allows a law enforcement agency to dispose of hazardous materials that have been seized as evidence once they have documented the materials. Current law that requires representative samples of hazardous material to accompany the supporting evidence before it can be admitted in court. The proposal allows photographs, videotapes, or laboratory analysis to be used for prosecution purposes in order to verify and document the quantity of hazardous materials.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
