FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

#Officials from the Office of the Attorney General, the Office of Administration, and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education assumed this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

#Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** assume this proposal could result in the loss of federal administrative grants of \$40 million per year to the Unemployment Compensation Administration Fund and the loss to Missouri employers of Federal Unemployment Tax Credits. The United States Department of Labor has informally indicated that the proposal does not conform to federal law. The economic impact on small business alone cannot be determined.

#Oversight assumes the proposal incorporates into state law existing policy regarding resignations, and that no fiscal impact would result from this proposal. Oversight assumes the proposal could be implemented through regulation without a federal disqualification of the state unemployment insurance program.
