ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** and the **Office of Attorney General** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Medical Services (DMS)** states Missouri Medicaid does not cover experimental treatment, tests, or drugs. Therefore, DMS states this proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agency. DOH assumes if a fiscal impact were to result, funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriation process.

DESCRIPTION


Under this proposal, informed consent for an experimental medical treatment is not required if the patient is subject to a life-threatening emergency and the research program or experimental medical procedure is conducted under certain federal regulations allowing for treatment to be started immediately and consent to be obtained later.

This proposal contains an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
