FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Economic Development**, the **Missouri Department of Conservation**, the **Department of Transportation**, and **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** state this proposal would not be expected to fiscally impact the operations of DOH. DOH states if a fiscal impact were to result, funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriations process.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Medial Services (DMS)** state the type of contraceptive described in the proposal is not currently cuovered and will continue to be non-covered if available by prescription only. Therefore, DMS assumes there would be no fiscal impact.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires emergency contraceptives to be dispensed only upon prescription by an authorized health care professional.
