Small businesses that conduct lead abatement could be affected by this proposal.


DESCRIPTION

This proposal modifies provisions relating to lead abatement. Currently, the Department of Health and Senior Services requires as a condition of licensure that all lead abatement contractors, including, but not limited to, those engaged in project design, risk assessment or inspection to purchase and maintain liability and errors and omissions insurance. This proposal would provide that only persons or entities conducting abatement or deleading activities purchase such insurance.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
