FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal would have a direct fiscal impact to small businesses engaged in brewing beer.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would permit underage culinary students to taste, but not consume, certain alcoholic beverage as required by a curriculum.


The proposal explicitly prohibits a student under the age of twenty-one from receiving any beer, ale, porter, wine, or other similar malt or fermented beverage unless the beverage is delivered as part of the student's required curriculum, and the beverage is used only for instructional purposes during classes conducted as part of the curriculum.

The proposal would also require that beer be brewed only from malt or a malt substitute, and would restrict the grains and other ingredients used in the brewing process.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
