#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses that sell refrigerated or individually packaged beer could be fiscally impacted by this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal prohibits any grocery store or convenience store from selling individually packaged beer or beer that is refrigerated below 60 degrees on the premises. The Supervisor of the Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control may suspend or revoke a license for any violation of this provision.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
