DESCRIPTION

This proposal specifies that individuals being detained by the court for evaluation to determine whether they are sexually violent predators and individuals who have already been determined to be sexually violent predators may be housed together in the same location by the Department of Mental Health.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
