## **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials of the **Department of Natural Resources - State Parks** assume no fiscal impact to their agency.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal is enabling legislation which grants administrative control of Regional Recreation Districts to the County Commission whenever the district is located in only that county and on land owned solely by that county. **Oversight** assumes this proposal does not require any new expenditure of funds, nor does it create any new revenues. Therefore, **Oversight** assumes no fiscal impact to state or local governments.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

### **DESCRIPTION**

Under this act, when a regional recreational district is organized in only one county on land solely owned by the county, the governing body of the county shall have the exclusive control of the expenditures of money in the regional recreational fund. It shall also have control of the public parks, trails, and recreational facilities owned, maintained or managed by the county within the district.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
