FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation adds telephone and cellular phone call logs to the forms of identification that can be used to commit identity theft.

The proposal also makes it unlawful for any person without legal authorization to purchase, sell, or otherwise obtain the telephone or cellular phone call logs of another individual without consent. A violation of this provision is a class B misdemeanor.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
