FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume the proposal requires sexual offenders who fail to register for a third time to be electronically monitored for ten years. DOC data indicates there has been an increase in convictions for failure to register and in FY05 there were 33 new sentences of which 70% are in prison and the impact for this proposal would be delayed due to that. Offenders are normally supervised to discharge for about four years, so the impact to this proposal would be to add six years to supervision. To date, there have been sixty-six offenders convicted, of which two offenders have three separate convictions (3%). This calculates to one offender per year (with a cumulative increase of one per each year through the ten-year scope of this note) who will be monitored for six years, but this impact will not begin until the fifth year out. These numbers are expected to increase as indicated by the trend for this type of violation.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in operational cost through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY03 average of \$3.15 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,150 per offender).

The DOC assumes the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume the proposal would not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors.

Officials from the Office of the State Public Defender did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation requires any sexual offender to be electronically monitored for a period of ten years if he or she is found guilty or pleads guilty to the crime of failing to register for a third time. Any fourth or subsequent violation will result in an additional ten-year period of electronic monitoring.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
