FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education** and the **Department of Public Safety, Office of the Director** and **Missouri Veterans Commission** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety, Office of the Adjutant General** stated this proposal would bring the state Tuition Assistance (TA) program more in line with the federal program, which only requires repayment if the soldier/airman fails to remain active in the guard while enrolled in a course of study for which tuition assistance was received. TA repayments over the past 5 years have averaged \$81,963 per year. Repayments are deposited back into the National Guard Trust Fund and are retained by the Office of the Adjutant General to support the tuition assistance program.

Oversight assumes the proposal would eliminate approximately \$82,000 per year in receipts from tuition assistance repayments to the Missouri National Guard Trust Fund.

DESCRIPTION


This proposal would modify provisions regarding repayment of national guard educational assistance grants. Recipients would no longer be required to repay state tuition assistance grants if they leave the guard within three years after receipt of their last tuition assistance grant.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
