FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety** assume the proposal will not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** assume there would be costs due to additional publishing duties related to the Director of POST's authority to promulgate rules, regulations, and forms. SOS estimates the division could require approximately 40 new pages of regulations in the Code of State Regulations at a cost of \$27.00 per page, and 60 new pages in the Missouri Register at a cost of \$23.00 per page. Costs due to this proposal are estimated to be \$2,460, however, the actual fiscal impact would be dependent upon the actual rule-making authority and may be more or less. Financial impact in subsequent fiscal years would depend entirely on the number, length, and frequency of the rules filed, amended, rescinded, or withdrawn. SOS does not anticipate the need for additional staff as a result of this proposal, however, the enactment of more than one similar proposal may, in the aggregate, necessitate additional staff.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from the **Jefferson City Police Department** assumes there would be minimal costs involved.

Officials from various other law enforcement agencies did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes the changes to Section 620.340, increasing the training requirements for local telecommunicators, would increase the training expense to local police and sheriff departments.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal authorizes the Director of the POST Commission to promulgate rules and regulations.

The proposal also requires all persons employed as a telecommunicator to complete at least twenty-four hours of ongoing training every three years. The current training requirement is sixteen hours every two years.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
