FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Education** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** assume their agency would be required to fabricate and erect signs informing all motorists that the rest areas are open to commercial motor vehicles only. The cost to replace all existing signs with the commercial vehicle restrictions would be \$5,969 for each rest area in both directions of the highway. There are 19 rest areas in the state, therefore a total of 38 signs (19 rest areas X 2 directions) would be required. Therefore, the negative fiscal impact of this legislation would be \$226,822 (38 signs X \$5,969 each). This would be a one-time cost to MoDOT.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires the Highways and Transportation Commission to close all rest areas to all vehicular traffic except commercial motor vehicles and truck-tractors or truck-tractor combinations. Under the at, the commission is also prohibited from building or constructing new rest areas. Both of these requirements will take effect on January 1, 2007.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
