FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This act allows Springfield and other cities to dissolve special business districts. Any proceeds from the disposal of the assets of the district shall be used by the city in a manner consistent with the purposes of such a district within the former district's boundaries.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
