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FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would specify that the determination of usual and customary fees for care in workers' compensation cases would be based on comparable volume based discount contracts of the health care provider. The Division of Workers' Compensation or the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission would have jurisdiction to hear and determine all disputes as to such fees. A medical fee dispute application would be filed with the Division or the Commission within two years from the date of the most recent medical service.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
