FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This act allows the St. Louis Board of Police Commissioners to delegate portions of its jurisdiction to other persons, including hearing officers. At the discretion of the board, a hearing officer may preside over disciplinary matters, prepare reports to the board or the police chief, and make recommendations to the board or police chief as to the allegations made during a disciplinary matter and the appropriateness of the recommended discipline.

The St. Louis Board of Police Commissioners would retain authority to render a final decision after a review of the evidence and reports of the hearing officer.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
