FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health**, **Missouri Department of Transportation**, **Department of Public Safety**, **Department of Insurance**, **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan**, and **Missouri Department of Conservation** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion the proposal, in its present form, has no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** assume the proposal will not fiscally impact the operations of the DOH. If a fiscal impact were to result, funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriations process.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DOS)** state the proposal would have no fiscal impact on the DOS because these provisions are already included in federal regulations regarding Sanctions for False or Fraudulent claims for Title XIX Services.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal provides that no licensed health care professional shall charge, bill, or solicit payment for anatomic pathology services, unless the services are rendered personally by the health care professional or under the health care professional's direct supervision. No patient, insurer, third-party payor, hospital, public health clinic, or nonprofit health clinic shall be required to reimburse any licensed health care professional for charges or claims submitted in violation of this proposal. Nothing in this proposal will prohibit the billing of a referring laboratory for services when samples must be sent to another specialist. The licenses of health care professionals violating the provisions of this proposal may be subject to disciplinary action.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
