ASSUMPTION

Officials from the cities and towns of: **Belton, Bernie, California, Harrisonville, Kearney, Knob Noster, Ladue, Linn, Pacific, Raytown, St. Peters, St. Robert, Sugar Creek, Sullivan, and Warrenton** did not respond to our request for a statement of fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes the proposal would not result in a significant savings to any single fourth class city or town providing they are paying members of certain boards up to \$200 per month. However, the total savings are unknown.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION

This proposal repeals the statute that allows fourth class cities, by ordinance, to pay members of the planning and zoning commission, board of adjustment, park board and board of police commissioners of the city up to \$200 per month.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
