FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Missouri House of Representatives, the Missouri Senate, the Office of State Courts Administrator, the Office of the Governor, the Office of the Attorney General, the Office of the State Treasurer, the Office of the State Auditor, the Office of Administration, Administrative Hearing Commission, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Economic Development, Division of Business and Community Services and Public Service Commission, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Higher Education, the Department of labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Public Safety, Office of the Director, Division of Water Safety, Missouri Veterans Commission and Missouri Highway Patrol, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Revenue, State Tax Commission, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, Joint Committee on Legislative Research, and the MODOT and Patrol Employees' Retirement System, assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** stated that many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$1,500. The Secretary of State's office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

In response to a previous version of the proposal, officials from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, the Office of Administration, Division of Budget and Planning, the Department of Economic Development, Division of Tourism, and the Department of Natural Resources assumed this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections**, and the **Department of Revenue** did not respond to our request for information.

Oversight assumes this proposal would have no significant fiscal impact on the state or its political subdivisions.
