#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **State Auditor's Office** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed within existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** (SOS) assume this proposal would resubmit the conservation sales tax to the voters every ten years. Statewide newspaper publication would cost approximately \$1,752 per column inch based on an estimate provided by the Missouri Press Service x 3 for multiple printings as required by the Constitution and state statute. The estimated total number of inches for this amendment is 10 inches including title header and certification paragraph.  $(\$1,752 \times 3 \times 10 = \$52,560)$ .

## ASSUMPTION (continued)

SOS officials state if a special election is called for this purpose rather than being voted on at a general election, the cost of the special election has been estimated to be \$1.2 million based on the cost of the past two such elections.

**Oversight** assumes the constitutional amendment would be put before Missouri voters in conjunction with the November 2006 general election. **Oversight** assumes any cost incurred by local elections officials would be absorbed within existing resources because the proposal would be on the ballot in conjunction with the general election.

**Oversight** assumes the constitutional amendment, if adopted by Missouri voters, could impact local jails. Oversight has not reflected any local fiscal impact because the proposal is contingent on voter adoption.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This constitutional amendment, if approved by the voters, allows all persons to be bailable, except for capital offenses and manufacturing or attempting to manufacture methamphetamine, when the proof is evident or the presumption is great. Currently, all persons, except for capital offenses, are bailable.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
