#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials of the **Missouri Department of Transportation** assume no fiscal impact to the department.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal only establishes a maximum speed limit that County Commissions can set on certain county roads, and does not require counties to post signs or to make any other expenditure of county funds. **Oversight** assumes no state or local fiscal impact.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This act establishes a maximum speed limit of 45 mph on county gravel, dirt and other unsurfaced roads regardless if such roads are posted with signs or not.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
