FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Missouri Department of Transportation** and **Greene County** assume that there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **City of Poplar Bluff** assumes this proposal would not have a huge fiscal impact but that it would take away authority from cities to regulate signage within their limits.

Officials at **City of Centralia** assume they may need to revise zoning ordinances which would cost \$45 for the public notice advertisement.

Officials at **St. Louis County** state the impact would depend on possible litigation. Some of the proposed provisions conflict with St. Louis County Zoning Ordinances. The St. Louis County Zoning Ordinance contains a provision (Section 1003.135, par. 2. (7)), which essentially states that advertising signs (billboards) be located on lots having a minimum of 12,000 sq. ft. and contain no other use. Paragraphs 5 & 6 of Senate Bill 129 appear to prohibit this provision of the St. Louis County Zoning Ordinance.

No other cities or counties responded to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes this proposed legislation will have no fiscal impact on state funds.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
