FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri State Highway Patrol, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Public Safety, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions & Professional Registration** and **Department of Conservation** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS)** state the proposal would have no fiscal impact on the DSS because these provisions are already included in federal regulations regarding Sanctions for False or Fraudulent claims for Title XIX Services.

Officials from the **Department of Highways and Transportation** assume this proposal would not have a fiscal impact on MoDOT/MHTC or on the MoDOT/MSHP medical plan.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency. DMH does not purchase these services.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

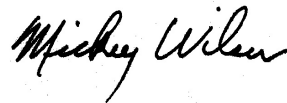
FISCAL DESCRIPTION
