#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation (DOT)** state it would cost approximately \$100,000 to implement an electronic bidding intermediary for Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission (MHTC) construction contracts, which is included in the DOT's current budget. The addition of electronic bidding capabilities would be the second phase of a pre-existing program. In addition to the implementation of this phase, the cost would also include the training of contractors.

This legislation would eliminate the DOT's requirements to print bid books and send addenda to contractors by certified mail. This would result in an annual savings of \$18,000 and \$72,000 respectively (\$90,000 total).

Under this proposal, the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission (MHT) is authorized to receive bids and bid bonds for any contract for construction, maintenance, repair, or

improvement of any bridge or highway on the state highway system electronically via the Internet. At its discretion, the MHTC may elect to receive both electronic and paper bids, or the MHTC may specify electronic bidding exclusively for any proposed contract.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
