FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

The **Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement (JCPER)** has reviewed this proposal and has determined an actuarial study is not needed under the provisions of section 105.660, subdivision (5).

Officials with the **MoDOT** assume the proposal would subsidize the creditable service by certain employees of the Missouri Department of Transportation and Civilian Patrol. The unfunded liability of the retirement system will increase, and at some point, cause an increase in the MoDOT and Patrol Contribution rate.

Oversight assumes there would be minimal fiscal impact to HTEHPRS due to the service buyback and earnings fund contribution of the uniformed Patrol member.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation (DHT)** assume their response will be identical to MoDOT and Patrol Employees Retirement System.

Oversight assumes, as stated above, there would be minimal fiscal impact to HTEHPRS due to the service buyback and earnings fund contribution of the uniformed Patrol member.
