ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions & Professional Registration** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Medical Services (DMS)** state this proposal requires licensed pharmacies to dispense contraceptives within the normal time frame following receipt of the prescription.
