#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Medical Services (DMS)** state this proposal provides for the Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) to promulgate rules and regulations concerning the manner and frequency of certain specified immunizations. The proposal also states the rules shall not require immunizations not specified in the legislation. Currently, the DHSS provides for the cost of these specified immunizations and Medicaid pays an administrative fee for giving the immunization. The DMS does not believe this legislation will impact Medicaid covered services. Therefore, this proposed legislation will not have a fiscal impact on the DMS.
