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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the University of Missouri, Economic Policy Analysis and Research Center (EPARC) assume this proposal would increase the exemption from state income tax for pension and retirement income. EPARC officials estimate that the proposal would reduce income tax revenues to the General Revenue Fund by about \$44 million dollars per year.

Oversight will use the EPARC estimate of tax reduction, and assumes this proposal would be effective beginning with 2008 tax returns filed in FY 2009.

This proposal would reduce Total State Revenue.
