FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Missouri Department of Conservation** (**MDC**) assume this proposed legislation would have fiscal impact on MDC funds since the Department would need to transfer point-of-sale database records to the Secretary of State's office every five business days. The approximate annual cost for producing database records would be \$2,600 plus administrative expenses.

Officials at the **Office of the Secretary of State** (**SOS**) assume this proposal would require the secretary of state's office to mail a postcard voter registration application to each person whose name is submitted to the secretary of state's office by the Department of Conservation. Postage for mailing 50,000 voter registration applications would have an estimated cost of \$26,000. The cost of additional staff at the secretary of state's office to fulfill the requests in an expedited manner would be would be over \$32,000 per year.

Oversight assumes that the Office of the Secretary of State can absorb the duties of mailing voter registration postcards to hunters with existing personnel.

Officials at the **Platte County Board of Election Commission** and the **Kansas City Board of Election Commission** assume that there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

No other Election Board responded to **Oversight's** request for information.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of
