FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Department of Insurance, Financial and Professional Regulation,
Department of Public Safety (DPS) - Director's Office, DPS - Missouri State Highway
Patrol, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Social Services, Missouri
Department of Transportation, and Missouri Department of Conservation assume the
proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan (HCP)** state anti-epileptic generic drugs that are approved at an AB-rating by the FDA are considered to be bioequivalent to the brand drug. According to the FDA, these AB-rated generics can be exchanged without harm to the patient. AB-rated drugs currently do not need prior notification and consent of the prescribing practitioner. Limiting generic drug accessibility may cause cost increases over \$100,000.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal could increase small business health care costs.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal provides that a pharmacist shall not substitute one version of an anti-epileptic drug for the anti-epileptic drug originally prescribed without prior notification and the signed, informed consent of the prescribing practitioner and the patient or the patient's parent, legal guardian, or spouse.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
