ASSUMPTION

Oversight sent response requests to numerous fourth class City Clerks, and none responded. A list of cities can be found in the not responding section of this fiscal note.

Oversight assumes this is enabling legislation which provides an option for the city's governing body to determine either a three year or four year term for the office of Mayor. Current law allows only a four year term. **Oversight** assumes no state or local fiscal impact.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.


