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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of State Courts Administrator, Missouri Department of Transportation, Department of Social Services, Department of Public Safety (DPS) - Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, DPS - Capitol Police, DPS - Director's Office, DPS - Division of Fire Safety, DPS - Water Patrol, Department of Corrections, and Missouri Department of Conservation assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **DPS** - **Missouri State Highway Patrol** defer to the Missouri Department of Transportation for response regarding the fiscal impact of this proposal on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume that this proposal would have no fiscal impact with regard to requirements to provide insurance to its employees. The AGO assumes there could be costs associated with any challenges filed against agencies that do not provide the insurance required under this proposal. The AGO also assumes that any challenges could be handled with existing resources. If the AGO has the handle multiple challenges under this proposal, the AGO will seek additional resources through the appropriations process.

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan (HCP)** state the HCP currently provides healthcare benefits to dependants of active vested employees and terminated vested employees who die. The dependants must notify HCP within 31 days of the subscriber's death to receive benefits. Dependants are responsible for the full cost of the premium. Continued benefits are also available for disabled employees and their dependants.

Dependants of employees who are not vested have the opportunity to elect coverage under COBRA for healthcare coverage up to 36 months.

The HCP notes that this legislation would not apply to public safety officers for the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri State Highway Patrol, or the Missouri Department of Conservation since they have separate health benefit plans.

The proposed legislation would have a fiscal impact on HCP of less than \$100,000 annually.

Officials from the **Taney County Ambulance District** state the fiscal impact of this proposal is unknown at this time.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal provides that any state agency, political subdivision, or other entity that provides health care benefits under the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan to employees who are within the definition of a public safety officer as provided in Section 173.260, RSMo, shall continue to provide the same health care benefits to any surviving spouse and dependents of such employee if he or she is killed or permanently and totally disabled in the line of duty.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
