FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of Administration** (**OA**) assume this bill would require OA-Division of Facilities Management, Design and Construction to request legislation for the Capitol Improvement Funds (CI Funds) and House Bill 13 funds. First, the need for funds to study the situation of the stacked offices in the Capitol. Second, additional funds, depending on the outcome of the study, to completely renovate the Capitol to meet the accessible to individuals with disabilities and/or relocate some offices to rental space that can not meet the accessibility needs which would increase House Bill 13 for additional rental space. Some office may need to be moved to temporary office space for renovations to take place.

The long range implications could be over several years in the CI Funds and in House Bill 13. The best guess without the case study would be \$50,000,000 to \$150,000,000. OA-ITSD would also need to be included in the study to determine their needs associated with this renovation.

Officials at the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume the direct impact to the MO House of Representatives would be minimal and could be absorbed within existing resources. It is assumed that all major capital renovation expenses, would be assumed by OA's Facility Management, Design and Construction.

Officials at the **Missouri Senate** assume no fiscal impact to the Senate's operational budget.

Oversight assumes this proposal would increase the amount of general revenue needed for the CI bill and HB13 due to the renovations required by this proposal. However, Oversight recognizes that it is impossible without further study to determine how the two funds would be effected. Oversight has shown all the costs in the first year as it is impossible to determine which years would have which expenses. Additionally, Oversight has shown FY10 and FY11 with "Unknown" costs do to the increased rent required for Capitol staff to move to other buildings while renovations are occurring.
