FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Department of Agriculture** assume no fiscal impact to their department.

Officials of the **Kansas City Manager's** office assume this proposal would cost the city \$15,000 annually. Officials stated that the City currently has a "Pit Bull" ordinance which generates fine revenue of approximately \$15,000 annually for animal control. Officials assume this would be lost if this proposal were to become law.

Officials of **Webb City** assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the City of West Plains assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the City of Centralia assume no fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes cities that currently have ordinances regulating specific breeds of dogs could realize a decrease in revenue generated from regulation fines. Oversight will show fiscal impact to municipalities as \$0 or a negative unknown.

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FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act allows any city, town, or village to adopt ordinances, orders, or regulations to control dangerous dogs, provided that no such ordinances, orders, or regulations are specific to breed. Ordinances, orders, or regulations addressing specific breeds of dogs adopted prior to August 28, 2008, shall be deemed invalid.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
