Bill Summary: Allows municipalities in St. Charles County to adopt ordinances for the well-being of the community and enforce such ordinances with a fine not to exceed \$1,000 or three months of imprisonment in the city jail.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **City of Wentzville** assume their fine revenues would stand to increase since the limit is being doubled. Officials stated they have no way of knowing since the decision of the amount of fine is determined by the Municipal Court Judge.

Oversight assumes this proposal increases the maximum fine allowed for ordinance violations. **Oversight** has no way of determining the amount of revenue that would be generated from the new cap on fines. The amount would be determined by the Municipal Court Judge. **Oversight** will show fiscal impact to certain cities as \$0 or Unknown.

Oversight would note that the current maximum allowed for ordinance violations in 3rd and 4th class cities is \$500. **Oversight** did not find a maximum for Towns and Villages.

Oversight assumes no state fiscal impact.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
