FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of the State Courts Administrator, Department of Conservation and the Department of Public Safety - State Water Patrol and Alcohol and Tobacco Control each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources (DNR)** assume the proposal has the potential for increasing Ranger activities in state parks which include navigable rivers within their boundaries. DNR would anticipate any fiscal impact to be minimal.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide competent, effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of Excess Alcohol Consumption on Missouri rivers, Mardi Gras Beads on Missouri rivers and/or styrofoam, polypropylene, expanded polypropylene or polystyrene coolers on Missouri rivers. These actions would be charged as a new class A misdemeanor.

Passage of bills increasing penalties on existing crimes, or creating new crimes, requires the State Public Defender System to further extend resources. While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide competent and effective representation is all its cases.

Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** stated that they could not predict the number of new commitments which could result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in the proposal. An increase in commitments would depend on the utilization of prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the courts. If additional persons were sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC would incur a corresponding increase in operational costs through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY 2008 average \$2.47 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$902).

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation would result in some additional costs, but it is assumed the impact would be \$0 or a minimal amount that could be absorbed within existing resources.
