FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to a previous version of the proposal (SCS for SBs 65 & 43, LR # 0503-03), officials from the **Department of Corrections, Department of Public Safety – Director's Office, Missouri Ethics Commission,** and the **Office of the State Public Defender** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

In response to a previous version of the proposal (SCS for SBs 65 & 43, LR # 0503-03), officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assumed any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed within existing resources.

In response to a previous version of the proposal (SCS for SBs 65 & 43, LR # 0503-03), officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assumed the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

In response to a previous version of the proposal (SCS for SBs 65 & 43, LR # 0503-03), officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** assumed the potential fiscal impact on county prosecuting attorneys will depend on the extent to which law enforcement agencies choose to enforce this provision and/or are able to enforce this provision. If law enforcement agencies make arrests under this provision, there may be an impact based on the additional cases that may be filed. OPS assumes this legislation would not have any significant fiscal impact on the OPS.

Oversight assumes county prosecutors could absorb any increase in cases referred to prosecutors within existing resources.

In response to a previous version of the proposal (SCS for SBs 65 & 43, LR # 0503-03), officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assumed many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this proposal for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes this is a small amount and does not expect additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the SOS can sustain with their core budget. Any additional required funding would be handled through the budget process.
