FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the Metropolitan Community College, Lincoln University, Truman State University, University of Missouri, Office of the State Courts Administrator, Missouri Southern State University, Department of Higher Education, Linn State Technical College, Missouri Western State University, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Missouri State University and the University of Central Missouri assume that there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide competent, effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of using a false diploma which would become a new Class C Misdemeanor.

Passage of bills increasing penalties on existing crimes, or creating new crimes, requires the State Public Defender System to further extend resources. While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide competent and effective representation is all its cases.

Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.
